Learning Outcomes

On this Pacific Northwest Geology and Astronomy adventure, experience the wonders of the universe through interactive workshops and explorations of the environment. Discover how volcanoes impact the landscapes around them, creating fascinating geological formations. Learn about Lewis and Clark's journey of discovery through the Columbia River Gorge, including the ecology and geology conveyed through their journals. Engage in hands-on ecology workshops on renewable resources and climate change. In astronomy classes, imagine the future of space research, identify the Earth's cycles and view the night sky by telescope. Go on an educational exploration of Crater Lake National Park to learn ecological concepts firsthand. See diverse wildlife in their natural environments, including a visit to a hatchery that nurtures a native fish.

Program Overview Pacific Northwest

Explore the natural world on this Pacific Northwest Geology and Astronomy program. Step into a model of a volcano at the Mount St. Helens Visitor Center with a view of the mountain over the wetlands. Wind along the wondrous Columbia River Highway, taking in spectacular scenery at Crown Point and all the way to the Columbia Gorge Discovery Center & Museum. Discover the geology of volcanoes and dig into the local cultural history at the Lava Lands Visitor Center. On an inspirational exploration of Crater Lake National Park, walk through the landscape shaped by volcanic activity more than 7,000 years ago. Stroll through the evergreen trees on a trail in Deschutes National Forest, and stop at Wizard Falls Hatchery to watch fish swimming in the waters below.

Engage in experiential learning activities to gain a deeper understanding of nature and the solar system. Learn geology in context at the Mount St. Helens Visitor Center in an educational activity that leads students through how volcanoes are formed and their impact on the environment. Go back in time while reading the journals from the Lewis & Clark Expedition and participate in interactive workshops on landscape ecology at the Columbia Gorge Discovery Center & Museum. At the High Desert Museum, students get to see how essential renewable resources are for the future of the Pacific Northwest while exploring the exhibits and interact with native wildlife. Gaze up to the stars at the Sunriver Nature Center & Observatory in two astronomy classes on research of the solar system and a night view of the stars by telescope.

Daily Itinerary (5 Days)

DAY 1 HOME, MOUNT ST. HELENS TO PORTLAND – VOLCANIC ERUPTION

Gather at Mountlake Terrace High School in the morning to board the motorcoach. Make a stop at the Mount St. Helens Visitor Center to explore the exhibits, learn from a park ranger and engage in a geological educational activity about the formation of Mount St. Helens and the impacts of the 1980 eruption. Continue on to Portland, taking a walking tour of the Pearl District and downtown areas on arrival. Enjoy dinner and check in to the hotel.

- Board the motorcoach at Mountlake Terrace High School
- · Stop at Mount St. Helens Visitor Center for the exhibits, ranger talk and educational activity
- Continue to Portland after lunch
- · Walking orientation of downtown Portland and Pearl District
- · Dinner and check in to hotel

DAY 2 PORTLAND, COLUMBIA RIVER GORGE TO BEND – EXPEDITION

Start out early from Portland for a day trip to the largest National Scenic Area in America, Columbia River Gorge. Stop along the Historic Columbia River Highway to take in the panoramic scenery from Crown Point. Next stop is at the Columbia Gorge Discovery Center & Museum, where students explore the exhibits and participate in a workshop on Lewis & Clark Landscape Ecology. Learn about the diverse ecology and geology of the challenging landscape that the Corps of Discovery crossed over 200 years ago on the Lewis & Clark Expedition. In the afternoon, travel to Bend. En route, stop at the Timberline Lodge in Mt. Hood National Forest, the filming location of the popular film "The Shining." Arrive in Bend in time for dinner and check in to hotel accommodations.

DAY 3 BEND - EARTH AND SKY

Begin the day at the High Desert Museum, featuring impressive exhibits on natural resources and explorations among native wildlife. Take part in a hands-on workshop, covering how renewable resources can impact climate change in the future of the Pacific Northwest. Afterwards, discover how geology, ecology, climate and culture are all connected at the Lava Lands Visitor Center. Spend the afternoon viewing exhibits at Sunriver Nature Center & Observatory and learning astronomy firsthand in two classes. In the first class, identify the Earth's place in the solar system and discuss future possibilities in space research. For the second class, gaze into the stars at night for two hours by telescope.

DAY 4 BEND AND CRATER LAKE – WEALTH OF NATURE

Take a trip from Bend to Crater Lake for a day of adventure. Crater Lake National Park is a wealth of educational exploration, where park rangers invite students into nature's classroom at the crater created by volcanic activity more than 7,000 years ago.

DAY 5 BEND, DESCHUTES NATIONAL FOREST TO HOME – HATCHERY

On the way home from Bend, stop at Wizard Falls Hatchery in the Deschutes National Forest. From the viewing platform, watch the fish swimming by, including rainbow trout, kokanee salmon, summer steelhead and many more. Go on a short trail walk, surrounded by the beautiful forest. Travel back to Seattle with a stop for lunch on own along the way.

Payment Terms and Conditions

Payment Terms

Option 1: Pay in full at the time of enrollment. Option 2: Set up automatic payments in two installments or monthly. Two-installment plan:

- At 180 days prior to departure, pay 50% of the program cost.
- At 110 days prior to departure, complete the other 50% of the full program payment.

Monthly: Our monthly payment plan is based on the date of enrollment, so the program cost is paid in full by 110 days prior to departure.

Upon enrollment, there is a nonrefundable fee of \$95 required before any payment plan is selected. This amount is subtracted from the overall program cost for all payment plans.

\otimes Cancellation Terms

Official cancellation requests must be mailed to Experience at help@experienceamerica.com. The parent or guardian of the participant may contact Experience to inquire about specific cancellation policies and procedures.

- At 150 days or more prior to departure, participants are eligible for a full refund minus the nonrefundable deposit of \$95, all nonrefundable fees and a cancellation fee of \$200.
- At 149 to 110 days prior to departure, participants are eligible for a full refund minus the nonrefundable deposit of \$95, all nonrefundable fees and a cancellation fee of \$400.
- At 109 to 45 days prior to departure, participants are eligible for a full refund minus the nonrefundable deposit of \$95, all nonrefundable fees and a cancellation fee of 50% of the program cost.
- At 44 days or less prior to departure, participants are no longer eligible for a refund.

To get ready for the trip, make sure students have the appropriate identification for travel and all registration forms are completed. Transportation information, accommodation details and packing lists will be sent 30 days prior to the trip.

Arrival Information

Our Tour Director meets students at the school as they board the motorcoach. We are happy to help with luggage and ensure that students arrive safely at their accommodations.

Orientation

Our Tour Director starts the students off with an orientation, introducing the program ahead and getting them accustomed to their new environment. Additionally, this is an opportunity for our team to get acquainted with the students and set the tone for experiential learning.

Accommodations

For this program, students stay in accommodations with quad occupancy corresponding to the destinations in the itinerary. Groups of 3-4 students under the age of 23 and of the same gender* share rooms. Program Leaders are responsible for assigning which students will room together and Experience will assign room numbers.

Meals and Dining

Two meals are provided daily, breakfast and dinner, with the freedom to explore local dining. We love to introduce students to new foods and our favorite cuisine in the area. Please let our team know if there are dietary restrictions for any of the students, so we can prepare for them in advance.

Activities and Education

Our Pacific Northwest Geology and Astronomy program guides students on an experiential learning adventure to discover the natural world and beyond. All transportation and admission costs of our scheduled activities are included in the overall price of the program.



\dashv Health and Safety

Our friendly and experienced team is available at all times over the phone to ensure students have the best support possible. During the program, our Tour Director will supervise students alongside your Program Leader and we will provide a night chaperone to ensure security in the hotel. If, for any reason, a student gets sick during our program, we will make sure they receive immediate care.


- Safety Student health and safety is our number one priority. If a student does not feel safe for any reason, they should report to a chaperone, Program Leader or Experience staff member as soon as possible.
- Personal Property Good common sense, respect and consideration for others as well as their property should be practiced while traveling. Students are responsible for any loss, theft or damage to their own belongings, and are financially responsible for any damage caused to property or facilities during their trip.
- **Facilities** Third-party facilities such as classrooms, transportation, hotels or homestays may be a part of your tour. It is the student's responsibility to keep their surroundings clean and respect the room and facilities at all times, including keeping noise to a minimum.
- Substances No use of tobacco for anyone under 18 years old or nonprescription drugs is allowed. All consumption and purchasing of alcoholic beverages and nonprescription drugs is strictly prohibited, even if the student is legally of age.
- Illegal Activities Local laws at the student's travel destination must be followed at all times. Students are subject to legal consequences and may be dismissed from the program at their own expense.
- Discipline Failure to comply with all rules and regulations outlined in the Student Code of Conduct, or directions given by chaperones, Program Leaders or Experience staff will result in consequences at the Program Leader's or Tour Director's discretion.




